Re: Antidumping Duty and Countervailing Duty Orders on Crystalline Silicon Photovoltaic Cells, Whether or Not Assembled into Modules, from the People's Republic of China


This letter concerns the antidumping duty (AD) and countervailing duty (CVD) orders on crystalline silicon photovoltaic cells, whether or not assembled into modules, from the People's Republic of China (PRC) and Renesola Ltd.'s shipments. In an effort to monitor compliance with the AD and CVD orders, we are requesting additional information from Renesola Ltd. concerning entries of its solar cells and solar modules during 2012 and 2013 (see Attachment I). Please submit the information requested in Attachment I to this letter, along with the appropriate summarization of proprietary data, as required by 19 C.F.R. 351.304(c), no later than **August 23, 2013**.

As stated in the required importer and exporter certifications introduced in the underlying investigations, any failure to substantiate a claim that panels/modules imported into the United States do not contain solar cells produced in the PRC will result in suspension of all unliquidated entries for which these requirements were not met and the requirement that the importer post an AD cash deposit or, where applicable, a bond, on those entries equal to the PRC-wide rate in effect at the time of the entry and a CVD cash deposit, or where applicable, a bond rate equal to the all-others rate in effect at the time of the entry. Furthermore, as noted in the required importer and exporter certifications, records pertaining to such certifications may be subject to verification by Department of Commerce officials.

ATTACHMENT I

1. For *EACH* supplier of cells located in a third country, please provide the following information (please identify the supplier for which you are answering the following questions):
 - a. state whether you had a tolling arrangement with the supplier or the manufacturer of the solar cells. If there was a tolling arrangement, please describe the arrangement in detail.
 - b. Regardless of whether you consider it a tolling arrangement, did you, or any of your affiliates, provide any inputs, including wafers, either directly, or through another company, that were used by the supplier, or its manufacturer.
 - c. If you answered “yes” in response to item b above, please respond to the following items:
 - i. identify the input provided.
 - ii. describe how the input was used in manufacturing solar cells.
 - iii. identify the quantity and value of the input provided to the supplier or manufacturer in 2011, 2012, and the first half of 2013.
 - iv. identify the supplier of the input and the country in which the supplier is located.
 - v. identify the manufacturer of the input, if different from the supplier of the input, and the country in which the manufacturer is located.
 - d. did you, or any of your affiliates, provide any services, or perform any processing, in connection with the solar cells which you purchased from the supplier?
 - e. If you answered “yes” in response to item d above, please respond to the following items:
 - i. identify the services or processing performed
 - ii. describe the role that the services or processing played in manufacturing or finishing the solar cells
 - iii. identify the value of the services or processing provided to the supplier or manufacturer in 2011, 2012, and the first half of 2013
 - iv. identify the company that provided the services or processing and the country in which the company is located.
 - f. To the best of your knowledge, please identify the production processes performed by the supplier, or manufacturer, of the solar cells that you purchased and the country in which each process took place.
 - g. Does the supplier or manufacturer have any facilities in the PRC?
 - i. If it does have PRC facilities, to the best of your knowledge, please whether these facilities were involved in producing the solar cells that you purchased from the company?
 - ii. If the PRC facilities were involved, please identify the inputs they provided or the processing they performed.
